### Vanni: A place to be visited to believe!

My wife and I were initially apprehensive visiting Vanni as we weren't sure what to expect. However our visit has given us more than I can begin to put into words. We were pleasantly surprised to see a complete civil administration in place. The system in place is efficient, incorruptible and friendly. We in fact felt more at ease in Vanni than in Jaffna.

The people we have had the privilege to work with we have found to be truly inspirational. From our fellow health care professionals in the field to administrative staff, volunteers we have come across have such enthusiasm for the work, mainly due to the fact that everyone sees the absolute need for what we are trying to do.

There aren't sufficient services and the obvious need makes our role easier.

Perhaps Vanni saw the worst of the conflict during the past several years, resulting in loss of hundreds and thousands of lives, displacements, destruction of properties and created a downturn economic growth. The population in this region is distributed over a vast remote area of land and there's a severe lack of accessibility to towns and virtually nil telecommunications. We travelled the length and breadth of Vanni and served in many remote areas such as Pooneryn, Akarayankulam, Mankulam, Mullaitivu and Puthukudiyiruppu.

Majority of the people over here are farmers who cultivate mainly paddy along with onion, chillies and tropical vegetables. During the war people had been displaced many times within the region and from the Jaffna peninsula having been made into a socially and financially disadvantaged population. The influx of displaced people and refugees into farming and fishing communities strains services and facilities beyond breaking point.

Since early 2002, when the peace process was initiated, Vanni started progressing though at a slow phase, towards a daunting task of nation building. What we still see in Vanni after two years of peace is the basic needs of the population are yet not met. Killinochchi now is the major economic centre and the main commercial area and administrative buildings are situated on the A-9 (Kandy-Jaffna) road, which was repaired hurriedly after the peace initiation, still evidently showing many potholes.

The current health status in Vanni is very poor although there's a very well structured health system utilising the available barely minimal resources, is being implemented. The secret of this surviving health system

is because of the dedication of the health care workers; majority whom are locally trained.

The victims of the conflict are many and include refugees directly displaced by the war and a wider group traumatised by the effect of the war. One of the major health problems is psychological health. From anxiety, depression to post-traumatic stress disorder – the list is huge. The wound is healing slowly but the scar remains. The demand for mental health and counselling services for this group is increasing.

Apart from psychological health issues, chronic medical problems such as diabetes, and asthma are prevalent in this region. Unfortunately there aren't adequate monitoring or treatment options available. Patients don't have home monitoring glucometer and they rely on antiquated inaccurate method of checking the urine for sugar. For asthma it's almost impossible to get either preventive or relieving puffers, even if it's available in the major centres like Killinochchi the price is exorbitant, a Ventolin puffer costs about Rs250.00 and a seretide costs about Rs1200.

Apart from the shelled-out and ruined buildings, the grim reminders of war, the parentless children, patients with disabilities caused by the war, are disheartening sight.

Children and adolescents of both sexes aged from 4 months to 20 years are housed in many "Illam"s in Vanni region and they are lovingly looked after by the many dedicated responsible souls. Many of these illams are depended on funds from Tamils residing overseas and other NGOs.

Recently there has been an emerging health issue of motor vehicle accidents, which occur particularly on A9 (Kandy-Jaffna) road, due to increasing vehicular movements and speeding drivers, despite strict traffic rules being imposed in selected areas.

Killinochchi is busy once again with emerging new buildings, restaurants, administrative offices, NGO's, Sports ground etc. A place and its people which saw one of the bloodiest battles not long ago, is now today proudly opening its arms in a welcoming embrace to share enriching experiences.

Our impression of Vanni has given us the inspiration to motivate like-minded individuals to contribute. It's a place that has to be visited to believe. The warm nature, and hospitality of the Vanni people, their motivation and enthusiasm to move forward and determination to regain their lost productivity are impressive and they yearn to rebuild a once proud land with the open invitation to one and all to lend a helping hand. These impressions are purely based on the current ground situation witnessed by us, in an unbiased manner.

An old man and woman were married for years, even though they hated each other. When they had a confrontation, screaming and yelling could be heard deep into the night. The old man would shout,


"When I die, I will dig my way up and out of the grave and come back and haunt you for the rest of your life!"
