ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2010

In order to explore different options to develop the land, the committee called for an emergency meeting on the 9th of January 2011 at a venue where a cricket match was organized to play between 8 Jaffna schools. CRICKET MATCH


A cricket match was organized by the Jaffna Schools Association in which 8 teams took part. Hartley College presented its team with some Hartleyites and some children of Hartleyites. The match started around 9am and went on late evening. Our players fought with all their energy. The sausage sizzles distributed in the match were interesting.



LAND AND DEVELOPMENT AT HARTLEY

The past pupil associations worldwide made generous contributions to buy a piece of land for Hartley College and vested the land on the Global Trust. The land is bordered by the drain on one side with the church on the other and the temple and the school grounds on other sides. The extent of the land is 9 ladchams. An auditorium has already been constructed on six ladchams of this land with the funding from govern-

ment costing around 8 million rupees. Actions are underway to transfer this 6 ladchams of land to the Department of Education. The balance land of 3 ladchams has now been requested to build bicycle shed for students. A rough estimation of the value of the remaining



piece of land of 3 ladchams is approximately 1.8 million rupees in market value. If this land is used to build the bicycle parks with the government allocation, it means the remaining land should also be transferred free of charge to the department. We are at cross roads in the decision making process whether to go ahead with the projects.
